
## Holiday Vouchers for FSM Pupils

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for **February 2024 Half-Term** will be open **until midday on 30 January**. Voucher emails will be sent from week commencing **5 February**.

If you have not received their vouchers by 7 February, please email <u>childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk</u>.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (benefits-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child. Families who have signed up previously do not need to re-register for February 2024 holiday vouchers. Families that have previously signed up will need to contact us with any changes to their circumstances (e.g. if the number of children eligible increases or decreases).







## **Healthy Packed Lunches**



- Please cut grapes in half, as whole grapes pose a serious choking hazard.
